

The Longest Loss: Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia

After the death, survivors' grieving may be complicated by the very nature of a lengthy disease process that often has changed their relationship with the deceased. Through a combination of compelling interviews and in-studio discussion, experts will discuss how to best help patients, families and themselves cope with loss and grief associated with these progressive illnesses.
